Train the Trainer Safeguarding Adults Awareness

The aim of the session is to train staff to deliver safeguarding adults awareness training to staff and volunteers in their own organisation.

Participants will be provided with a set of training materials that they can use back in the workplace including handouts, exercises, quizzes, case studies, PowerPoint presentations and a link to a safeguarding awareness film. The pack contents cover all the materials for a half day or full day awareness session and a ninety-minute update session.

Learning outcomes

- Describe what is meant by abuse and neglect and be able to recognise the indicators of abuse
- Describe your organisation's procedures for safeguarding adults and your role within them
- Recognise your duty of care to adults at risk
- Describe how to promote the adult at risk's choice and control and understand the Making Safeguarding Personal agenda
- Identify the principles of the Mental Capacity Act (2005) and understand that adults with capacity can make decisions which may seem unwise
- Describe what is meant by consent and the rules of information sharing
- Identify how to ensure immediate safety of an adult at risk of harm
- Identify how to inform the appropriate person in your organisation of a safeguarding adults concern
- Describe how and where to record concerns about abuse and neglect
- Describe how to use the 'Whistleblowing' policies and procedures
